Evil & Sin

Sin is not an acceptable topic of conversation these days. It's okay to converse about diseases, harmful environmental effects, or negative physiological influences when dealing with what used to be called evil and sin. I wonder. Are sin and evil only myths of the dim past? Jesus, whom we believe to

be true, real, and part of the present, not the past, doesn't seem to think so. Jesus seems to think that both exist. Jesus sees sin and evil as an oil slick, quick to defile pure and innocent shores; as asphyxiating weeds, bound to choke the freshly sown seed. Jesus took sin and evil very seriously. He took great care to point them out and to cast them out wherever he went. He took great pains to exorcise evil and to combat sin far and wide, as far as the cross.

Vanquishing Evil & Sin

We who claim to be doers of God's will and thus "brother, sister, and mother" to Jesus, can take up his crusade against evil and sin. And we can do it without fear; first of all, because Jesus triumphed on the cross; and second, because we have the powerful word of God on it, a word that announced our triumph from the very beginning. After all, God's word is creative. It does what it says: it vanquishes sin, it leads to redemption. All we must do is be receptive to it. Then, no matter our vocation, no matter our failings, no matter how puny our faith, God's mighty word in us will triumph over evil, will cast out all sin.

Memorial of Barnabas, Apostle–June 11, 2024 One, Holy, Catholic, Apostolic

In our recitation of the Nicene Creed at Sunday Mass, we profess our belief in "one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church." Those four adjectives are called the four "marks" or "attributes" of the Church. **One**, because despite the many divisions and denominations of Christianity all worship one God, one Spirit, and one Lord, Jesus Christ. **Holy**, because, like sacred objects, the church is set apart for God's purpose. **Catholic**, from the Greek word for "universal," because it is for all without excluding any group or class of people. **Apostolic**, because it arises out of the efforts of the apostles, both the original 12 and others, like today's saint, Barnabas, who were later named apostles. And like you and me, called today to embody these same attributes.

Memorial of Anthony of Padua, Franciscan Priest, Doctor of The Church–June 13, 2024 Saint of the Lost and Found

Many folks, when they lose track of their car keys, glasses, or phone, say a quick prayer to Saint Anthony. He's probably best known as the patron saint of lost objects—think of the countless prayers for his intercession he's received! The story goes that he lost a precious book once, feared it had been stolen, and prayed to find it. Soon after, it was returned by the novice who had taken it. Little losses can feel like big annoyances, but what about the big things lost that slip away little noticed? Like our relationship with God and with others that slowly disappear when neglected.
