### March 29/30, 2025—Fourth Sunday of Lent



#### "Let Us Celebrate With a Feast"

As we leave winter behind and enter into the home stretch of our Lenten journey, we have good reason to celebrate. We know that with each new

sunrise we will enjoy more warmth and daylight. We know also that Christ, our risen "Sun," is bringing more and more warmth and light into the world with each new day. How better to celebrate than with a feast! The first reading, the psalm, and the Gospel for this Sunday all refer to feasts. Each of these feasts celebrates what the psalm calls "the goodness of the Lord." He then leaves his own banquet to encourage his elder son to "celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again."

#### **Ministry of Reconciliation**

All three of these feasts point to the one banquet that we will celebrate in the promised land of heaven, and that we anticipate in the eucharistic banquet. At the Eucharist we celebrate the infinite forgiveness and love God has shown us in Christ. However, we are not simply to relax at the table and drink in our own forgiveness. St. Paul reminds us that God has "given us the ministry of reconciliation." Like the brothers in the parable, God's generosity to us should open our hearts to forgive and ask forgiveness of our brothers and sisters in Christ. Like the father in the parable, we are to be "ambassadors for Christ," extending "the message of reconciliation" to all those who need Christ's reconciling forgiveness. The heavenly banquet will not be complete until all people come to the feast and "taste and see the goodness of the Lord."

**Reading I:** *Joshua* 5:9*a*, 10-12—The people celebrate the first Passover in the promised land.

**Responsorial:** *Psalm 34*—Taste and see the goodness of the Lord.

**Reading II:** 2 *Corinthians 5:17-21*—Jesus reconciles us to his Father.

**Gospel:** *Luke* 15:1-3, 11-32—Forgiveness and reconciliation are reasons for celebration.

#### **Catholic Social Teachings**

The three Catholic Social Teachings workshops we hosted this month were a great success. Thank you to all the parishioners, including your friends, who attended the workshops.

We had close to 45 attendees at each of the sessions. The response from the attendees was enthusiastic and encouraging. Our attempt was not only to educate, but to change hearts. It seems we succeeded as the energy at the end of the three sessions was positive and hopeful. I am sure there will be a surge of radical kindness in the next several months and, hopefully, for years.

Len Marabella, a parishioner and member of the Pastoral Council, presented the idea for the workshops at a Pastoral Council meeting many months ago. Monsignor Pulskamp was very encouraging and gave Len the green light. Len organized a group of fellow parishioners (Marcy Fox, Barbara Gasparini, Mike Hanlon and Mike Apicella) to help him flesh out a program. For many months we worked at developing a three-session workshop on Catholic Social Teachings. Special credit goes to Len Marabella and Marcy Fox who were involved in leading all three sessions. Len brought in at least nine guest speakers or story tellers, who brought real life experiences to the seven themes of Catholic Social Teachings. They were inspiring and were responsible for actually "changing hearts."

- 3. Rights and Responsibilities
- 4. Option for the Poor and Vulnerable
- 5. The Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers
- 6. Solidarity
- 7. Care for God's Creation
