December 28/29, 2024 The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary & Joseph

Holy Families

Today's scriptures describe three families and their efforts to do God's will. Such efforts make them grow in holiness. The first family is Hannah, Elkanah, and Samuel. Hannah does something that only a woman who has given up her baby for adoption might fully understand—she leaves her long-awaited child to be raised by a priest in the service of the Lord's temple. Hannah recognizes that this is God's will for her and for Samuel. Both are "dedicated to the Lord."

Next, we hear about the Chirstian family, "children of God." The first letter of John encourages us to "do what pleases God." By focusing on doing God's will we will help one another to become more holy, more like the children of God that we truly are. Finally, we listen to a story about Mary, Joseph, and Jesus. It involves a typical dynamic in family life, with the adolescent son seeking independence and the parents responding with "anxiety" and hurt. As in our own families, it seems that Joseph, Mary, and Jesus didn't always agree on what it meant to do God's will.

Doing What Pleases God

Like Mary and Joseph, who "did not understand" why Jesus remained in the Temple, we will not always understand what God has in mind for us through the struggles of family life. It may be difficult to know how to "do what pleases God." Today's reading from the First Letter of John gives us some guidance. If we put our faith in Christ and "love one another" we will grow together in holiness. With Jesus we will "advance in wisdom and age and favor before God and man." God's will is that we all love one another and grow together into a holy human family.



Sunday, December 28-29, 2024The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary & Joseph

Reading I: 1 Samuel 1:20-22, 24-28— Hanna conceived, and at the end of her term bore a son whom she called Samuel.

Responsorial Psalm: *Psalm 84*—Blessed are they who dwell in your house, O Lord.

Reading II: 1 John 3:1-2, 21-24—See what love the Father has bestowed on us that we may be called the children of God.

Gospel: *Luke 2:41-52*—The boy Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. They found him in the temple, in the midst of the teachers.

All In the Family

Families come in all sorts of shapes and sizes. One thing they all share, however, is that they are not perfect. "Perfect families do not exist," said Pope Francis in a 2015 address. "This must not discourage us. Quite the opposite. Love is something we learn; love is something we live; love grows as it is 'forged' by the concrete situations which each particular family experiences. Love is born and constantly develops amid lights and shadows." As we remember the Holy Family, let us also recommit ourselves to this kind of love within all our family experiences.

Solemnity of Mary the Holy Mother of God— January 1—Holy Day of Obligation

January 1 is the Octave of Christmas, the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God, and a holy day of obligation. Mary is often referred to as the "Mother of God" or "God-bearer" and the earliest recorded use of this was by Origen, one of the Fathers of the Church who used the Greek word "Theotokos" in the year 230. It is generally believed Christians first celebrated the feast sometime in the 6th Century. The Byzantine, Coptic, and Roman calendars all assigned the feast to different days, and it wasn't until 1974 that St. Pope Paul VI assigned it to January 1st.

Since this is a holy day of obligation, your first challenge is to go to Mass. Your second challenge is this: St. Pope Paul VI said that on this feast we should renew our adoration to the newborn Prince of Peace, by asking for the intercession of Mary, the Queen of Peace, in observance of a World Day of Peace.

The Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary traditionally contained three sets of mysteries—the Joyful, Sorrowful, and Glorious—each set reflecting on five events in the life of Jesus and Mary. In 2002 Pope Saint John Paul II introduced a fourth set, the Luminous Mysteries, which included the Baptism of the Lord, the Wedding at Cana, the Proclamation of the Kingdom, the Transfiguration, and the Institution of the Eucharist. Each of these additional mysteries reveals a facet of the identity of the Lord. Saint Irenaeus wrote of the Transfiguration: "The glory of God is a live human being and a truly human life is the vision of God." Take time to know Jesus better by praying the Luminous Mysteries.
